



A FLAVOUR OF THE NORTH COTSWOLDS...


Stay a few nights in the famously beautiful Chipping Campden, then enjoy exploring the north Cotswolds towns and villages including Chipping Norton, Stow-on-the-Wold and Moreton-in-Marsh.

DAY 1

Explore Chipping Campden with is wonderful high street and learn more about the Arts & Crafts movement with a visit to Court Barn Museum.

With Cotswolds Distillery, Cotswold Foodstore & Café and the famous Pudding Club nearby, your visit gets off to a flying start. Visit Stow-on-the-Wold where you can learn more about the foodie tips in the area by booking a bespoke Cotswold Foodie Tour. Stow offers a perfect lunch stop, with a wealth of antique shops, boutiques, delis and lovely eateries. Take a small diversion to the pretty village of Kingham, home to the renowned Daylesford Organic before ending your first day with a Cotswold cream tea in the energetic market town of Chipping Norton.





Chipping Campden is a vibrant market town in the heart of the north Cotswolds, renowned for its creativity, arts and commerce as well as the beauty of its buildings. Chipping Campden is the start or maybe the finish of the Cotswold Way, over a 100 miles long-distance footpath to/from Bath.

Both Chipping Norton and Stow-on-the-Wold are famous for antique and boutique shops as well as being the highest towns in the Cotswolds.

WHERE TO STAY

Choose from a range of accommodation in Chipping Campden including the **The Kings Hotel**, **Cotswold House Hotel & Spa** or for food lovers stay in a pudding themed room at **Three Ways House Hotel**. The town and surrounding area has an excellent range of bed & breakfasts.



HIDDEN GEMS

On Silk Street visit the **Gallery at the Guild** before climbing the old stairs to step back in time at **Harts Silver Smiths**. In Stow-on-the-Wold visit **St Edwards's Church** and the market cross to learn more about the Civil War.

TOP TIP

With so many gardens located in north Cotswolds, stay longer to visit gardens such as **Hidcote**, **Kiftsgate Garden**, **Bourton House Garden** and walk in lavender fields at **Snowshill**.



DAY 2

Explore Moreton-in-Marsh where you can taste cheese or waffles before walking around the beautiful Batsford Arboretum or see birds of prey at Cotswold Falconry. Drive onto famously pretty Upper and Lower Slaughter and see The Old Mill before visiting Bourton-onthe-Water. One of the best known villages in the Cotswolds, it has a host of attractions for families such as Birdland Park & Gardens, Cotswold Motor Museum and The Model Village. Adam Henson's Cotswold **Farm Park** is just a short drive away.






HIDDEN GEMS

Pop into Bakery on the Water for some tasty snacks, before walking to the nature reserve at Greystones Farm & Salmonsbury Meadows Site of Special Scientific Interest and Salmonsbury Camp Scheduled Ancient Monument.
